## **Prepare for a flood:**

Ask your local council if your area floods
Know where to go for safety and safe routes to get there
Check your insurance policy is current and covers you for flood
Keep a list of emergency contact numbers in or near your phone
Put together an emergency kit including a battery-powered radio, torch and spare batteries

### **During a flood**

- Never drive, ride or walk through floodwater
- Check local and social media for information, updates and advice
- Keep in contact with your neighbours
- Be ready to evacuate if advised by emergency services
- Act early as roads may be closed or obstructed by flooding or obstacles
- Follow the advice of emergency services



### **Returning after a flood**

Make sure the electricity and gas is turned off before going inside
Use a torch to inspect buildings
Check your home and property for damage
Don't use gas or electricity until they have been checked for safety
Drink only bottled or boiled water until the normal water supply has been declared safe by health authorities
Do not allow children to play in or near floodwaters

### **Emergency kit**

#### My emergency kit has:

Battery-powered radio with spare batteries
Torch with spare batteries
First aid kit
Candles and waterproof matches
Important papers including emergency contact numbers
A copy of my home emergency plan
Waterproof bag for valuables
When you decide to leave add these items:
Mobile phone and charger
Prescriptions, medications, toiletries
Clothing and strong shoes
Non-perishable food and drinking water
Anything special you need for other family members
If you have pets don't forget

- Keep your emergency kit in a waterproof storage container
- Regularly check and restock items in your emergency kit (e.g. use-by dates on batteries)
- Keep a list of emergency contact numbers in or near your phone
- Check your gutters are clear
